So many of our people, young or old, male or female look at the things that put them at a disadvantage, rather than look at the uniqueness of themselves. We don't have to walk around with signs

telling how great we are, but because of who we know and not what we know, we have the formulas for success. With Christ all things are possible and as believers we must reach beyond our possibilities and be the best that God wants us to be. As we listen to the words of the Psalmist, he promises us that if we put our trust in the true and the Living God, we shall flourish. He tells us in verse 12, that "The righteous shall flourish like the Palm tree; he shall grow like a cedar in Lebanon." Palm trees are known for longevity, and in our text it implies to the believer, you will live long and you will also flourish. You shall prosper at whatever you undertake. Somebody needs to know today that you are not limited by

someone else's expectation or limitations for your life. If you can see it, you can be it. With Christ in your life, you can determine your own destiny. So often people become discourage by the negativity that our critics produce, but be responsible for yourself. With God before us, we can dream and achieve the goals that we see. Sometimes, we must take responsibility for not reaching our goals. When we limit our possibilities, we do ourselves a great disservice. As I think of the great heroes of our faith, David was just a shepherd boy; the youngest in the family. But Nathan, God's prophet, looked beyond his youth and said to young David, you are the man. Caleb was an old man, one of the last survivors from Egyptian slavery, but God allowed him at the age of 85, to see and

Are you in need of some help with food? Do you know of someone that needs help with food? Hope Mobile Food Bank of South Jersey and the Outreach Ministry of Second Baptist Church is here to help you to put food on your table. Everyone you know is going through some kind of problem and God has looked down on Second Baptist and looked to us to help people in their time of need. What do we do? We open our doors to be a drop off for food to the community. A tractor-trailer comes to the church around 10:00 am every second Saturday of the month and drops off food for people who signed up ahead of time and also on that day. You can receive your food starting around 11:00 am through 1:00 pm. Anyone who wants food for that day can wait in line for their time to collect their food. We have served over 200 people in a day. Initially, we started with 99 people in March and now are up to 217 people in July. As you can see, the numbers have grown because people are in need of help. to claim God's Promised Land. When God is in the picture there are no limits on our possibilities. And as God has called us to minister to a dying world, we as missionaries cannot allow ourselves to be hindered by our tendency to judge folk, but we must remember from God's perspective, all souls are important and all souls belong to him. From the lowliest beggar to the neighborhood drunk, God loves and cares about his own. The message that we bring to a world discouraged by its own failure is that God can take our nothingness and make it into greatness. We may see that drug addict or alcoholic, or even that prostitute who is in a state of degradation as unimportant or unworthy, but it was for the downtrodden, the poor, and the needy that Christ went to the cross to save. He came not to save the righteous, but to bring sinners into repentance. In the social programs, we endorse in the political realm, every program we plan is a temporary bandage. It does not fix the problem, but when we carry the message of Christ to those who are on the bottom rung of the ladder, his spirit can reclaim, rebuild and revive his deadness and give him hope in the mist of his despair. It is time for the church to be the healing station that Christ has assigned it. It is time to reach out and reach down to help and to lift those who have fallen. Whatever state they may find themselves in. God has not given up on them and if they look to him, he will flourish them. Verse 13 says, "These that be planted in the house of the Lord shall flourish in the courts of the Lord." When church allows itself to act as God's agent, we can inspire even the least of them to greatness. From God's perspective, he can turn them around with the washing of his blood. From God's perspective he can make the worst of sinners the best of saints. Look at the record, the apostle Paul was on his way to close down the church at Damascus,

but from God's perspective, he met Paul on that Damascus Road at high noon and changed him from a persecutor of the church to a preacher in the church. Come here Peter, a fisherman, a brawler, a liar and a cusser. Jesus called him and made him a fisher of men * and to make it personal Christ came into my life when I was at my lowest and called me to become his angel in the church. And if the truth be told, we can find our past record in 1 Corinthians 6:9-11. "Know ye not that the unrighteous shall not inherit the kingdom of God? Be not deceived, neither fornicators, nor idolaters, not adulterers nor effeminate, not abusers of themselves with mankind, not thieves, not covetous, not drunkards, not revilers, not extortionist, shall inherit the kingdom of God and such were some of you, but you were washed, but ye sanctified, but ye were justified in the name of the Lord Jesus and by his mercy we are not consumed. It is only by his grace we have been spared and he has called us into the ministry of reconciliation to reach out to the lowest of low and give them a hand up from God's perspective they are worth saving. We have a word to share with the perishing.

Let me give you three things to tell the world.

1. Look within. Within you is the breath of God's spirit.
2. Look around. A world looking for hope.
3. Look up – The source of our strength

Penns Grove High School girls track and field head coach Marcus Dowe graduated from Penns Grove in 1998 with a Group I state intermediate hurdles title under his belt when current boys coach Tom Mason was already heading up the Red Devils squad.

And 23 years after earning *Today's Sunbeam Track Athlete of the Year* honors, Dowe can now enjoy the 2011 Girls Track Coach of the Year award.

"This is a very high honor, very prestigious to me," said Dowe, who had personal bests of 54.3 and 13.9 in the two hurdles events as a high schooler. "I see Schalick undefeated all those years and I say,

Wow, that's phenomenal. So to be recognized above (Cougars head coach Mark Boyle) and those other coaches is a very esteemed and high honor. I strive to be my best and I teach that to my girls."

Any time a Red Devil comments on Dowe's coaching, she'll mention a quote that the coach lives by when it comes to work ethic.

"I continue to tell them, 'Pain is temporary. Success lasts forever,'" Dowe quipped. "I tell them every day before practice and meets. I explain to them that these aren't just



words. They have meaning. When you have the success, the pain isn't even in question."

Dowe gave plenty of credit to his supporting staff, which extends far beyond assistants Joe Baker and Lisa Peeke. The Devils' fan base is the cream of the South Jersey crop.

"I'm proud of this and I put it on my girls and my coaching staff. Joe Baker and Lisa Peeke were tremendous assets," Dowe said. "(Track Athlete of the Year) Faleesha Dowe has a very close-knit family and they show a lot of support. There's a supporting cast

that's not just me (Faleesha's cousin), but other cousins, parents, aunts, uncles and the whole family."

And while Dowe's relatives won't always be under his tutelage, the Devils' leader plans to stick around his home town for years to come.

"Ten to 20 years from now, my allegiance is to the girls team," he said. "I don't see myself going anywhere. When I started I had seven girls, and I'm not even talking about just the state meet. I started and I was losing, so there was no way to go but up. I'm going to keep building this program."

"I hope to leave a phenomenal program in Penns Grove track."

Red Lobster Cheese Biscuits Recipe

Ingredients:

1 t Garlic salt or powder
1 tb Parsley flakes
1 t Italian seasonings
5 lb Bisquick
44 oz Water, cold
1 lb Cheddar, sharp grated
1/2 c Butter

Directions:

Preheat oven to 450 degrees. Mix bisquick, water and cheese. Drop by large spoonfuls onto greased baking sheet. Bake for 8 10 minutes. After baking, (while hot) brush on melted butter or margarine mixed with garlic powder, parsley flakes and Italian seasoning. (Amounts will vary by the size batch you make, but a little goes a long way.)

Tips and Variations:

Serve hot. The recipe is for a large quantity, so you'll have to reduce the ingredient quantities by the size batch you desire. Note: For a smaller batch you may use 2 C. Bisquick, 1/2 cup cold water, and 3/4 c. grated cheddar which will yield about 12 biscuits. You may also substitute soda water or ginger ale for the water, if desired.

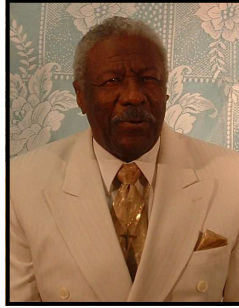

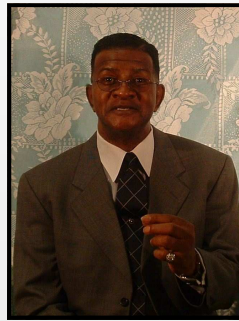
